Smart Financial Rules

- **Keep emergency cash accessible** (both AED and USD)
- Use **2–3 banking platforms**
- Keep some funds outside your primary account
- Inform your bank before making sudden international transactions

Visa Survival Rules

- **Do not rely on visa flexibility**
- Overstay fines can apply immediately
- Policy changes happen quickly during disruptions

Best Approach:

- Always know your visa expiry date
- Plan your exit before deadlines
- Verify rules through official UAE sources

Fastest Exit Routes from Dubai

If major flights are disrupted, consider:

Muscat (Oman)

4–5 hour drive + active airport

India (Mumbai, Delhi, Bangalore)

Affordable & frequent routes

Doha (Qatar)

Major regional hub

Saudi Arabia (Riyadh/Jeddah)

Strong international connectivity

Always check real-time availability before deciding.

Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Waiting too long to act
- Keeping all money in one bank
- Ignoring visa deadlines
- Relying entirely on insurance
- Not having backup communication options
